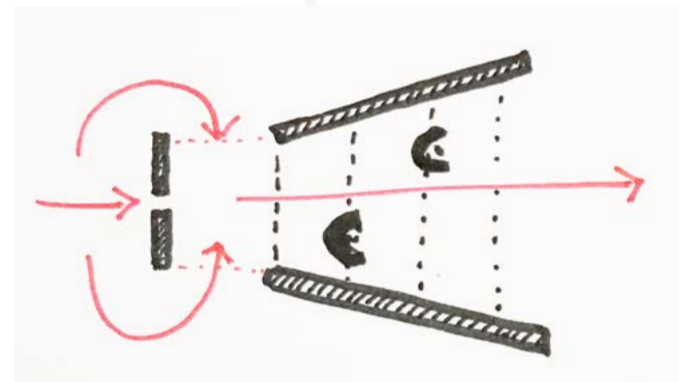
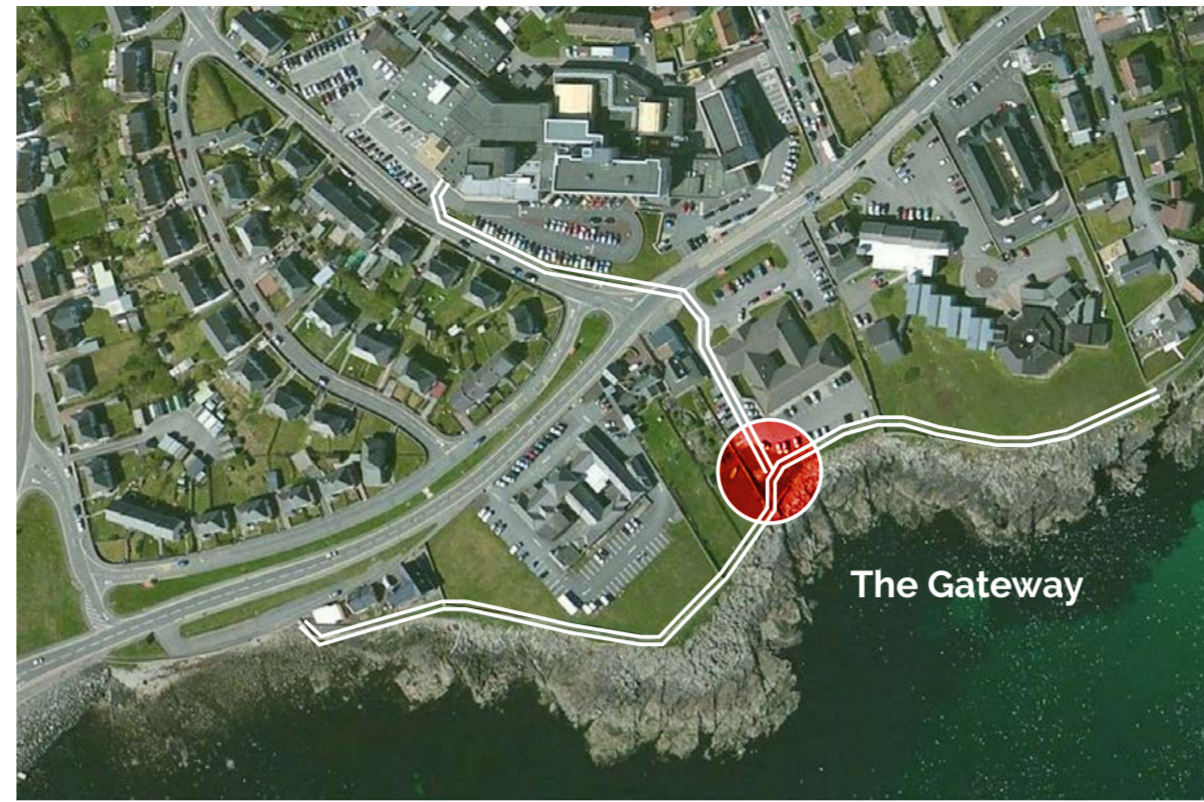
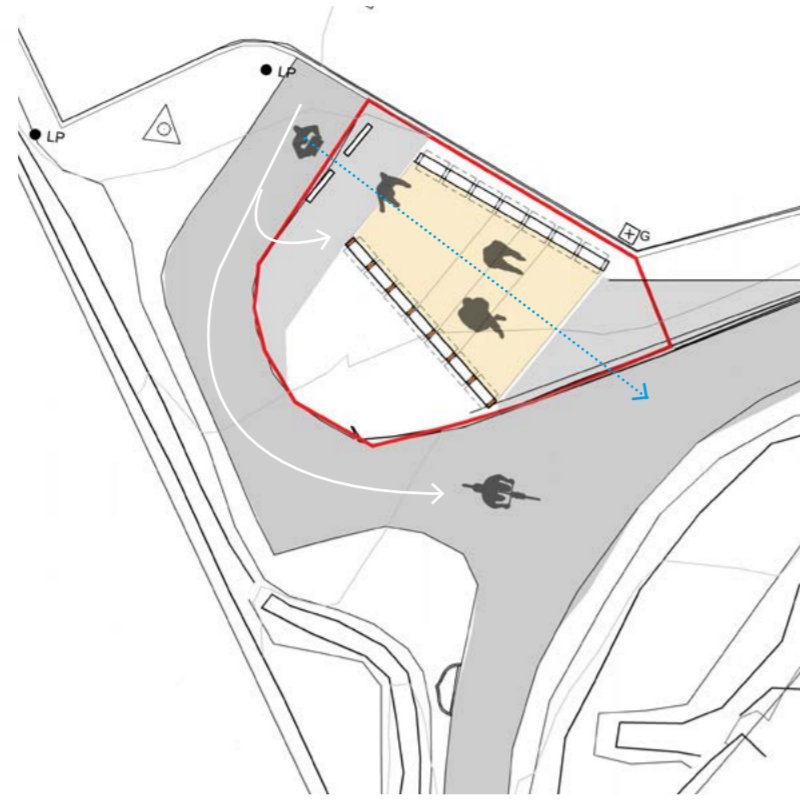


THE SQUEEZEBOX

SLETT'S PARK SHELTER AND VIEWPOINT

Its like a folding accordion that people can sit in. The timber members frame and focuses on the scenery beyond, revealing the view as you move through the structure. The charred timber external cladding contrasts with the warm ply interior finish, creating a warm and inviting internal space.



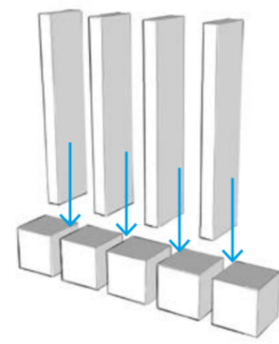
The view is deliberately restricted either side on the upper path. Emphasising the framed view when you enter into the shelter.



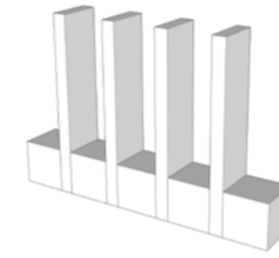
Similar to ancient standing stones that often frame a view in the distance. The vertical elements act as a gateway moment before entering the shelter.



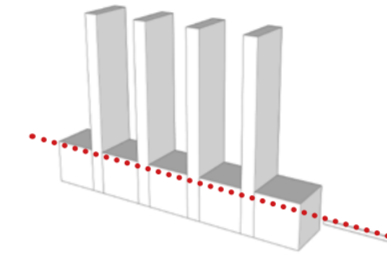
These vertical elements will also provide wayfinding information about the Slett's coastal pathway.



A gabion constructed base anchors the timber flank walls.



The timber members slot between each gabion basket.



A tie rod is then positioned through the gabion baskets and timber members, securing the structure in place.
